AT A GLANCE

## WHO WE ARE

Nashuk LP is a jointly owned partnership between Tseshaht First Nation and ROGA Group. Weaving the rich cultural values of Tseshaht First Nation into our services, Nashuk provides general timber harvesting and delivery, road building and maintenance, civil and earthworks, and residential development services to Tseshaht's territory (entire Alberni Valley, along the Alberni Inlet to the Broken Group Island and out to sea). Nashuk delivers a range of industry-leading services while maintaining a strong commitment to environmental sustainability and community development, including:

- ▶ **Timber Harvesting and Delivery**
- ▶ **Utilities and Earthworks**
- ▶ **Road Building and Maintenance**

Nashuk LP is dedicated to creating lasting benefits for the Tseshaht community by prioritizing meaningful employment opportunities and enhancing capacity building. Nashuk drives community growth by building capacity through equity in assets such as **equipment purchasing** and offering **comprehensive workforce training programs** for employee skill development.

## COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Nashuk's partnership model ensures that **50%** of all income is returned to Tseshaht First Nation, reinforcing the principle that prosperity should stay rooted in community. Since launching in January 2024, Nashuk LP has harvested and delivered large quantities of timber in Tseshaht territory and established the foundation for equipment ownership that builds lasting equity for Tseshaht.

Nashuk actively promotes community employment and engagement by sharing local job opportunities and project updates on our social media pages. As we continue to grow, **we're creating new pathways for Indigenous talent across construction, forestry and environmental services** to strengthen Tseshaht's presence in the industry and supporting community workforce development.

# Tseshaht First Nation

HIGHLIGHTING OUR PARTNERSHIP

**Tseshaht First Nation** is a vibrant and self-determining Nuu-chah-nulth community located on the west coast of Vancouver Island, British Columbia. Their territory includes the entire Alberni Valley, along the Alberni Inlet to the Broken Group Island and out to sea. With ancestral ties to the land and sea, the Tseshaht are descendants of expert whalers and knowledge holders. Formed through amalgamation, Tseshaht absorbed the **hiikuułʔath** and the **ħačaaʔath** who brought their lands with them as well as the once independent territories of the **našʔasʔath**, **maqłiiʔath**, **čuumafasath** and the original **čišaaʔath**. Tseshaht carries forward a proud legacy of stewardship and cultural strength rooted in its territory.



Tseshaht First Nation is committed to cultural continuity, community wellbeing, and self-determination through **education, responsible land stewardship, economic sovereignty, member employment and training**, and **partnerships that advance reconciliation** and shared prosperity.

## TSESHAHT FIRST NATION'S ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND PARTNERSHIPS

Tseshaht First Nation is actively advancing initiatives spanning community services, development, and economic sectors across **construction, forestry, fisheries, housing, education, public works, health care and childcare**. Tseshaht works collaboratively with neighbouring First Nations, municipalities, industry partners, and provincial and federal governments to advance sustainable regional growth.

## NASHUK LIMITED PARTNERSHIP

**ROGA and Tseshaht First Nation began working together in 2019**, and our successful project history led to the creation and launch of Nashuk LP in **2024**. Nashuk LP is rooted in a **shared vision** for Indigenous-led natural resource management, economic development and long-term community benefit.

Nashuk LP was formed to advance beyond project-based collaboration and **combine complementary strengths toward shared ownership and long-term benefits**. By combining Tseshaht First Nation's leadership, land stewardship, and community vision with ROGA's technical expertise, equipment and operational experience, the venture supports sustainable employment and high-quality service delivery. Grounded in shared values and mutual respect, the partnership reflects a long-term approach to economic growth that strengthens the Tseshaht community while advancing responsible development.

# Project Highlights

CELEBRATING OUR SUCCESS

## CANAL MAIN PROJECT

Nashuk LP successfully led a \$350,000 realignment project on a 25 km logging corridor near Port Alberni, commissioned by the Ministry of Forests. This project improved road safety and efficiency by flattening high grades, enhancing sightlines and reinforcing roadbed stability.

Core work included 1,400 meters of grade reduction, new culverts, cross drains, and precision blasting. Subcontractors included Coastal Bridge Construction, Ryder Contracting, and Van Con, with a Tseshaht crew boat providing oversight. Operations began in February and concluded in March 2025 and showcased Nashuk's ability to deliver complex infrastructure work while supporting local employment.

## MACTUSH ROAD RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT

Nashuk LP led the BC Timber Sales' Mactush Road Reconstruction Project as the Prime Contractor in 2025. In partnership with Ryder Contracting, our crews rebuilt 2-3km of road off Port Alberni's 25.7km canal main logging road. Operations took place between September and October and entailed excavation, rock hauling, drilling and blasting.

The project generated over \$270,000 in project value and demonstrates Nashuk's commitment to deliver quality results, strengthen local infrastructure and develop meaningful partnerships that drive community growth

## ROAD BUILDING & MAINTENANCE

Over the past two years, Nashuk LP has delivered over \$1.5 million in road construction and deactivation projects across Tseshaht territory. These works supported safe access to forestry sites, protected environmental features and opened pathways for future development.

Each phase of work contributes to safer access routes, supports stewardship, and enhances capacity for long-term land use planning.

## FORESTRY

Nashuk LP harvested 35,000m<sup>3</sup> between our contract with Mosaic Forest Management and Tseshaht First Nation licenses in 2025. This upcoming year will see increased forestry activity as we perform on Cisa licenses and contracts with Mosaic.

This shared effort reflects a strong commitment to sustainable forest stewardship and responsible economic development within Tseshaht territory. Our consistent forestry operations provide stable revenue and employment opportunities while upholding environmental and cultural values.



# Nashuk LP

## LOOKING AHEAD

Nashuk LP is actively preparing to support multiple community-led development projects, including new housing subdivisions, utility installations, commercial and mixed-use spaces, and access improvements. Alongside our forestry operations, these initiatives will continue to provide employment opportunities for Tseshaht First Nation members along with skill training to build capacity within the community.

In the next year, Nashuk will be working on several projects in the regional district, led by Tseshaht First Nation, that represent critical investments in health, safety and economic diversification. Nashuk's organizational capacity is positioned to grow alongside Tseshaht's priorities, ensuring that essential infrastructure is built with community benefit at the forefront.

As Nashuk LP continues to grow, our focus remains on building long-term equity, expanding training and employment for Tseshaht members and delivering infrastructure that strengthens Tseshaht's economic foundation.
